Unit Eligibility:

- Unit must be chartered by a Catholic institution (i.e. Parish, Knights of Columbus council, Parish Men's Society, Holy Name Society, etc.)

Purpose:

- Cooperation, development, and program are the key words in the recognition of Catholic chartered units in earning the *National Catholic Quality Unit Award - Pope Paul VI*. The adult leadership responds to training not only in Scouting lores, but training in Catholic Scouter Development, and religious counseling. The Scouts in each Pack, Troop, Team, and Crew/Ship respond by participating in the religious emblems program respective of their status in Scouting. The Diocese of Raleigh has adopted this award as our diocesan Quality Unit Award, and each unit is strongly encouraged to earn this prestigious award.

Requirements:

Presentation:

- The presentation should be made by the Pastor to the unit during Mass, Court of Honor, Youth Awards Ceremony, or other appropriate ceremony.

Time Requirements:

- The award covers one calendar year.

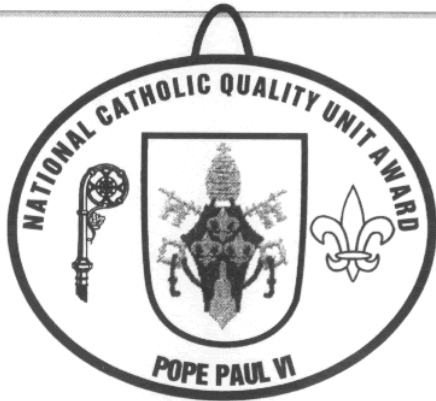
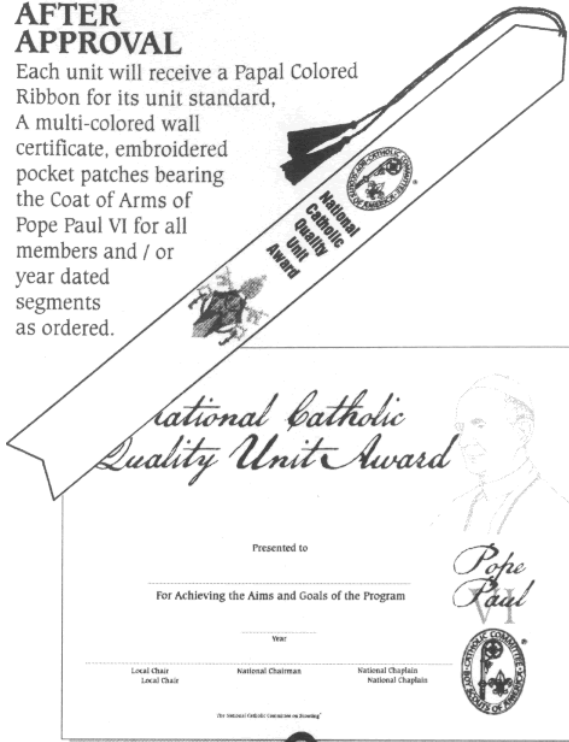

MAJOR FEATURES

Eligibility is that unit be chartered by a Catholic sponsored organization, e.g. Parish, Knights of Columbus, Parish School, Knights of St. Peter Claver, etc.

BSA packs, troops, crews or ships chartered to Catholic parishes, schools or organizations may earn this award.

Requirement areas cover adult training and leadership, service by the unit, religious emblems, religious activities, vocation awareness, relationships and membership.

Units may earn this recognition on their own merit for a particular charter or calendar year and may re-earn it in succeeding years if the requirements are met yearly.

After meeting the requirements, sign the application on the reverse and submit it with the proper fee to your Diocesan Catholic Committee or office for Scouting. The Diocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting will review this application and consolidate orders from eligible units onto one order form.
